
Welcome to Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time July 28, 2024

What Will You Bring to the Table?

Music has often helped enhance my memory through catchy tunes. A favorite song of mine is You Raise Me Up by Brendan Graham and Rolf Løvland. I was surprised to find that what I thought was such a tried and tested hymn has only been around for a little over 20 years. Its message offers so many lessons, particularly, that with God's help, we can achieve the infinite.

We often think our efforts are not enough. Who am I, amongst all the pristine social media profiles advertising "success stories" of the rich and famous? In today's Gospel the disciples, overwhelmed by the hungry crowd, say to Jesus: "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" The young boy who offered his five loaves and two fish may have initially been perceived as a minor character and perhaps still is today. We don't know the boy's name or his backstory, but he stepped up, providing that sustenance through which Jesus could work a miracle. Without his offering, it is unclear what might have happened next.

God teaches us that we are nourished by the gifts we offer to one another. Even the simplest of actions, like offering a shoulder to cry on when someone has lost a loved one, can make a big difference. Whether young or old, we can often feel helpless in situations that seem overwhelming. However, we must remember that nothing is insurmountable for God. As the chorus of You Raise Me Up declares, "I am strong, when I am on your shoulders. You raise me up to more than I can be."




Woman of Inspiration Dinner

Rediscovering Your Catholic Faith

From the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Section Two: The Profession of Faith

CHAPTER TWO: I Believe In Jesus Christ the Only Son of God

"JESUS CHRIST DESCENDED INTO HELL; ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN FROM THE DEAD"

126. What place does the Resurrection of Christ occupy in our faith?

The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ and represents along with his cross an essential part of the Pascal Mystery.

127. What are the signs that bear witness to the Resurrection of Jesus?)

Along with the essential sign of the empty tomb, the Resurrection of Jesus is witnessed to by the women who first encountered Christ and proclaimed him to the Apostles. Jesus then "appeared to Cephas [Peter], and then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time" (1 Corinthians 15:5-6) and to others as well. The Apostles could not have invented the story of the resurrection since it seemed impossible to them. As a matter of fact, Jesus himself upbraided them for their unbelief.

128. Why is the Resurrection at the same time a transcendent occurrence?

While being a historical event, verifiable and attested by signs and testimonies, the Resurrection, insofar as it is the entrance of Christ's humanity into the glory of God, transcends and surpasses history as a mystery of faith. For this reason the risen Christ did no manifest himself to the world but to his disciples, making them his witnesses to the people.

129. What is the condition of the risen body of Jesus? The Resurrection of Christ was not a return to earthly life. His risen body is that which was crucified and bears the marks of his Passion. However it also participates in the divine life, with the characteristics of a glorified Body. Because of this the risen Jesus was utterly free to appear to his disciples how and where he wished and under various aspects.

130. How is the Resurrection the wor of the Most Holy Trinity?

The Resurrection of Christ is a transcendent work of God. The three Persons act together to what is proper to them: the Father manifests his power; the Son "takes again" the life which he freely offered (John 10:17), reuniting his soul and his body which the Spirit brings to life and glorifies.

131. What is the saving meaning of the Resurrection? The Resurrection is the climax of the Incarnation. It confirms the divinity of Christ and all the things which he did and taught. It full-fills all the divine promises made us. Furthermore the risen Christ, the conqueror of sin and death, is the principle of our justification and our Resurrection. It procures for us now the grace of filial adoption which is a real share in the life of the only begotten Son. At the end of time he will raise up our bodies.



Do you remember your very first Bible? Perhaps it was a christening, first communion, or confirmation gift. Perhaps it was a required purchase for a theology class, or a treasured heirloom passed on as you embarked on a new life journey. Maybe it was big with beautiful pictures or maybe it was a small pocket version. It could have come with a beautiful sentiment or important family history inscribed on the inside cover. The Bible is likely the most unappreciated gift we receive. We say "thank you," flip through the pages, and put it on a shelf or tuck it in a drawer.

We know we will never read it cover to cover. We know that we will hear the most important parts at Mass. However, do we know that the Bible answers life's most important questions: Why am I here? What's my life's purpose? How can I get to heaven? Do we know that it also gives practical advice: How can I be a good wife, a great mother, a better friend? Do we know that we can always turn to the truth found only in Scripture to build our lives on a solid foundation?

Something truly amazing about the God of the universe is His willingness to patiently teach us. If you long to be grounded in truth, then pull that Bible off the shelf and join us for Walking With Purpose beginning September 12. Gain a deeper appreciation for the Bible and cherish it as the most beautiful and best gift you ever received!

Marriage:

The bride, groom, or either of their parents must be registered, contributing members of the parish. Weddings must be scheduled no less than six months out in order to fulfill the diocesan marriage preparation requirements. If there were any previous marriages that were not annulled by the Church, then it must be pointed out that the annulment process could take up to two years.




